- Firing Time** Firing will begin at 8:00 AM each day

- Steve Cunico has reserved some competitor housing rooms. If you are planning on staying at the center, ask for the rooms that are reserved.
- Additional housing is available at many motels in nearby Raton, New Mexico. Recommend that reservations be made early for the competition housing. The Center will start accepting housing reservations on February 1, 2010. These are two person rooms and sharing with other competitors is recommended. More information on the N.R.A. - Friday, June 11th will be a preliminary match at 300, 500 and 600 yards with unlimited sighters and 10 shots for record in 15 minutes time. Firing will commence at 8:00 AM. There will be monetary awards.

- Rules** Current N.R.A. High Power Rifle rules will govern.

Entries Limited

Entries are limited to 100 competitors. Post entries will be accepted up to the stated limit of the range, provided such entries will not require squadding of extra relays.

Fees

Individual entry fee will be \$75.00 for three days or \$40.00 for one day. Entry fees include \$5.50 to N.R.A. for registered match and \$15.00 per day for N.R.A. Whittington Center for range fee. The Whittington center raised their daily fee from \$10.00 to \$15.00 per day.

Squadding

All matches will be squadded. Squadding tickets for individual matches will be issued at 7:00 AM each day at the stat office. A competitor who fails to pick up his squadding ticket will only be squadded to fill up vacancies.

Classification

The N.R.A. Mid-Range classification system will be used in all matches. Any individual or team may elect, before firing to compete in a higher Classification than the one in which classified. Such individual or team must fire in the higher classification throughout the entire tournament. International competitors without N.R.A. U.S.A. classification will Compete in the highest classification.

Scoring

Competitors will score; any competitor failing to perform his/her scoring Duties may be disqualified. Scoring system (b) will be used.

Target Service

Competitors will pull their own targets.

Target

300 yard – MR63
500 yard - MR65
600 yard = MR1

Sights

Saturday: Matches 1-3 will be metallic sights only, except F Class
Sunday: Matches 5-7 will be any sights.

Empty Chamber

Empty chamber indicators are required and must be used at all times,

Indicators	except preparation time and firing.
Categories	Any rifle, Service rifle (includes Reserve and National Guard), Civilian service rifle, Palma rifle and F Class.
Division by rifle	Any rifle (Division A), Palma Rifle (Division P), F Class (Division F) and service rifle (Division S)
Course of Fire	Saturday June 12th
	Match 1
	Any rifle, metallic sights, two sighting shots and 20 shots for record in a time limit of 22 minutes at 300 yds.
	Match 2
	Any rifle, metallic sights, two sighting shots and 20 shots for record in a time limit of 22 minutes at 500 yds.
	Match 3
	Any rifle, metallic sights, two sighting shots and 20 shots for record in a time limit of 22 minutes at 600 yds.
	Match 4
	Aggregate of Matches 1-3.
	Sunday June 13th
	Match 5
	Any rifle, any sights, two sighting shots and 20 shots for record in a time limit of 22 minutes at 300 yds.
	Match 6
	Any rifle, any sights, two sighting shots and 20 shots for record in a time limit of 22 minutes at 500 yds.
	Match 7
	Any rifle, any sight, two sighting shots and 20 shots for record in a time limit of 22 minutes at 600 yds.
	Match 8
	Aggregate of match 5-7
	Match 9
	Grand Aggregate of match 1 - 7
Classes	The classes are: High Master, Master, Expert, and Sharpshooter, provided that there are sufficient entries in a class to warrant awards.

Award disposition There must be 5 or more entries in a class for one award, 8 or more for two awards and 13 or more for three awards. If there are fewer than 5 High Masters entered, they must fire for open awards only. The High Master class may not be combined with the Master Class.

Cash will be given to each Match winner and to Individuals in each Division by Class on Saturday and Sunday in accordance with a schedule which will be posted at the Stat Office prior to commencement of Firing.

If there is fewer than the required number of entries in a class to provide awards, they will be combined with the same class in another division. If there are still fewer than 5 entries after combining the divisions there will be NO AWARDS provided in that class and all competitors in the lower class will be moved back to their respective division in the next higher class, until there are a minimum of 5 competitors in the combined classes.

Procedure for clearing the firing line:

At no time is anyone to leave the firing line with a loaded rifle! All competitors are to be responsible for safe rifles while on the firing line. At no time should a competitor get out of position without the Empty Chamber Indicator being placed in the empty chamber and the competitor's scorekeeper verifies that fact. Penalty for breaking this rule is disqualification from the match for both the competitor and scorekeeper. Anyone that fires a shot during the preparation period will be scored a miss for the first record shot of that match. Anyone that fires a shot prior to the preparation period or any other non firing period will be disqualified from any further competition.

Challenge Period The Challenge period ends ½ hour after the posting of the match results
